

The Wednesday Wars

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Students are asked to get a hard copy of this book to read this summer and annotate. Class discussion and a written assessment will occur during the first week of school.

We will be reading this book this summer and looking for a) the ways that the main character walks through and overcomes conflict and b) the ways that the main character's perspective changes.

To prepare you for class discussion and a paper when we return to school, please complete the following steps as you read:

1. On the inside front cover of your text, make a list of characters and their traits each time a character is introduced. Add observations with a parenthetical page number as you read.
2. At the end of each chapter, record a one-to-two sentence summary.
3. Go back to the top of the chapter and identify the type of conflict present in the chapter. Make sure to include the type (internal/external), and the subtype (man vs. self, man vs. man, man vs. nature, and man vs. society). In addition, add the page number where the conflict is present.
