

WHAT IS THE ELCA FUND?

- ELCA Fund is the primary method of support to our school outside of tuition and fees.
- Donations allow administration to provide the extra resources that enhances the education of our students.
- Most successful Independent and Private Schools generally rely on tuition and fees to cover 85% to 90% of their budget.

WHY SHOULD I GIVE TO THE ELCA FUND?

- All donations to the ELCA Fund are tax deductible as allowed by law (as you know, mandatory tuition and fees are not tax deductible).
- A higher giving percentage from our faculty/staff and parents opens the possibility for our school to receive funding from **outside organizations and foundations** (several years ago, we received over \$500,000 from 2 Metro Atlanta foundations for our capital improvement campaign).

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, INC.

- Georgia GOAL is a needs-based tuition assistance program which provides financial support to students transferring from public schools, certain home school students, or students just starting K5.
- These are state tax dollars that you will already be paying, which you are allowed to <u>re-direct</u> to support students at ELCA.
- This program allows you to pre-pay your state income taxes and tell the state how you want this portion of your taxes spent.
- GA GOAL is already taking reservations for the 2024 tax year.

5 Reasons to Participate in GOAL

Through this education tax credit, you are empowered to invest in your local community at no cost! Seize the opportunity to keep your tax dollars local.



New for 2023: Business that pays insurance premium tax

75% of annual tax liability, but credit shall not exceed \$1 million

- We ask that you make your reservation for the program as soon as possible for the 2024 tax year. You will choose Eagle's Landing Christian Academy as the recipient of your funds.
- Georgia State Department of Revenue will then give you notice of your approved amount in January 2024 (with the ability to fund anytime within the next 60 days).

AP Capstone Program

AP Capstone[™] is a diploma program based on two AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. These yearlong courses focus on developing the critical thinking, research, collaboration, time management, and presentation skills students need for college-level work.

In AP Seminar, typically taken in 10th or 11th grade, students choose and evaluate complex topics through multiple lenses; identify credibility and bias in sources; and develop arguments in support of a recommendation. AP Seminar is a project-based learning course. Official AP Seminar assessments include research reports, written arguments, and presentations completed during the academic year. Students complete the course by taking an end-of-course written exam in May.

In the subsequent AP Research course, students design, execute, present, and defend a yearlong research-based investigation on a topic of individual interest. They build on skills developed in AP Seminar by learning how to understand research methodology; employ ethical research practices; and collect, analyze, and synthesize information to contribute to academic research. Like AP Seminar, AP Research is a project-based course. Each student's official AP Research score is based on their academic paper, presentation, and oral defense. There's no end-of-course exam for AP Research.






Orton-Gillingham – Grades K-2


- This structured literacy approach introduced the idea of breaking reading and spelling down into smaller skills involving letters and sounds, and then building on these skills over time.
- It also pioneered the <u>multisensory approach</u> to teaching reading, which is a common component of effective literacy programs. This means that instructors use sight, hearing, touch, and movement to help students connect language with letters and words. Orton–Gillingham is widely used to teach students with <u>dyslexia</u>.


